The Saskatchewan Band Association runs a week-long summer Band Camp in Regina. The camp offers comprehensive instruction for woodwind, brass and percussion students who have one or more years of playing experience. The camps are designed to assist in the improvement of performance skills that relate directly to the positive experiences of playing in a large ensemble. The camp provides an excellent way for students to learn new musical and technical skills, make new friends, have fun, and improve sound and technique.

The camps include full band, private lessons, sectional instruction, small ensembles, master classes, theory, ear training, rhythm training, sight-reading, staff performances, recreation and social activities, as well as a final student's public concert.

We offer a number of summer music camps throughout Saskatchewan that provide an introduction to music (singing, world drumming, guitar, ukulele, keyboarding) and are intended to interest youth in music. Camps are free and are directed towards children living in inner city and transient neighbourhoods. Information is provided at the end of the camp for families to access Creative Kids funding to help pay for ongoing lessons or involvement in musical programming.

This program has been in operation since 2012 and we have had great success in encouraging music participation with up to 62% of participants being engaged in music during the school year following camp.
